# Developing children's **aesthetic** and **cultural awareness** through making and responding in the **visual arts**

In this practical session participants will be involved in exploring line, pattern and symbol as elements of visual art. Anne-Marie Shin and Sally Heinrich will explore an inquiry based method which will support educators to plan for inquiry based arts learning with young children.

Sally and Anne-Marie collaborated to work with children in the Carclew Children's map project where 3-5 year old children worked from their own photographs of the city to develop their visual art works in a collaborative group process.

This workshop will support educators to see opportunities in their programs to inspire children and build on their ideas. Participants will learn some basic print making techniques and also some ways of supporting children to be both appreciative and inspired by a variety of artwork.
