

What is **Bicultural Mentoring**?

Mentoring will support the meaningful inclusion of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander (ATSI) children, and children from Culturally and Linguistically Diverse (CALD) backgrounds by supporting educators to work with children from these backgrounds.

Historically, bicultural support engaged a translator to work with a child. As bicultural support workers were usually engaged from outside agencies, they did not always have the knowledge of early childhood settings. Support provided did not always set up for longer term success, including tools or advice to support children when the Bicultural worker was no longer present.

Gowrie's cultural mentor would support the educators in the service to build their capacity to support children from ATSI and CALD backgrounds. Funding can be accessed through the Innovative Solutions stream of the Inclusion Support Programme.
